- 10 pupils took part in weekly breakfast club opportunity
- 100% pupils take part in Level 1 school Games competition (intra house) opportunities (KS2)
- 30% pupils take part in formal school sports clubs and practices (KS2)
- 40% pupils take part in Level 2 School Games competition (inter school) opportunities (KS2)
