

# PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT

## Policy Statement and Budget

Additional funding has been provided to schools since April 2011. It is allocated to pupils from low income families who are eligible for free school meals and children who have been adopted from care. Pupil premium was extended in 2012-13 to pupils who have been eligible for FSM at any point in the last 6 years (known as Ever6). A smaller amount is also received by schools for children of service personnel. The category of FSM / CLA pupils has now been re-classified as 'disadvantaged'.

### Provision at Haselbury Plucknett First School

We aim to provide holistic support for our pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium funding to ensure they can develop to their educational, personal and social potential whilst at Haselbury.

When making decisions on how best to spend this money, the Headteacher and governors have considered the research available on the subject, most specifically that from the Sutton Trust.

The tables below show the amount of funding the school that has received and how we intend to spend the funding this academic year.

Children eligible for PPG will be allocated funding to enable them to access:

- Academic support - £2,250
  - Intervention/Booster groups in KS2 (additional teaching assistant time)
  - Small group intervention and 1:1 support in KS1 (additional qualified learning assistant time)
  - Additional LSA/HLTA hours within classes so that a flexible approach of timely intervention can be used by TA/Class teacher
  - 1-2-1 Tuition for pupils who require specific catch-up.
  - Phonics and reading support
  - Enrichment activities in school
  
- Pastoral support - £750
  - behaviour, attendance,
  - social / emotional support including TA interventions (ELSA programme)
  - informal mentoring of pupils provided by TAs
  - ELSA support continued training costs and resources needed to provide these programmes
  
- Enrichment activities – £ 500
  - Support for school visits and to attend extra-curricular activities
  - Swimming costs
  - Breakfast club provision (Early Risers)
  - Music Tuition
  
- Teaching resources and materials to support specific programmes where PP children are involved to improve academic and emotional development. This includes ICT materials (£250)

£810 Yet to allocated and will be available to use as needed to support Pupil Premium children when reviewing progress at Pupil Progress Meetings.

### **Impact of our Pupil Premium Provision 2016/17**

7 Pupils were in receipt of Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) in 2016/2017 (2 of these pupils were Service Children.

#### Foundation Stage

0 pupils in the foundation stage received the PPG.

#### Pupils in Years 1-4

5\* out of 7 PP children are at least at expected standard for their age group in reading. 7 out of 7 pupils made at least expected progress.

5\* out of 7 PP children are at least at the expected standard for their age group in writing. 7 out of 7 pupils made at least expected progress.

5\* out of 7 PP children are at least at the expected standard for their age group in maths. 6 out of 7 pupils made at least expected progress.

\*One of these pupils is on the SEN register and receives higher needs top up funding and is assessed at p scales. This child made good progress from their starting point.
